Greyhound Trainer charged for race day treatment

Queensland Racing Integrity Commission (QRIC) Stewards have today charged Queensland Greyhound Trainer Terrence Auckram with breaching race day treatment rules, fined him \$1000, with \$500 suspended for 12 months and withdrawn his dog from racing tonight.

Stewards convened an Inquiry into the circumstances of the breach today after Mr Auckram admitted to administering a treatment to a Greyhound on race day.

QRIC Acting Commissioner Mark Ainsworth said the Integrity Investigations Team (IIT) inspected Mr Auckram's Queensland kennels today and found a syringe at the property.

"Mr Auckram admitted to QRIC officers that he administered a substance to the Greyhound 'Shoes To Fill' on the same day it was set to race in the Group 1 Ubet Gold Cup Final at Albion Park tonight," Mr Ainsworth said.

"Stewards found Mr Auckram guilty of race day treatment under Greyhound Australasia Rule 83A (1). Under the provisions of the rule Stewards have withdrawn 'Shoes to Fill' from competing at Albion Park tonight."
